Companies must be nominated either through a financial institution, accounting firm, attorney, etc. or may be self-nominated.

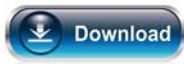

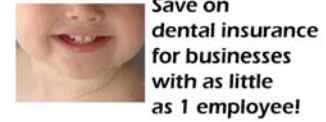
